Glassmaking in the Vysočina Region

Czech glass continues to enjoy an excellent reputation around the world. Glassmakers from the Vysočina Region have fully participated in establishing its good name. Their glassworks and skilled hands create original products and represent Czech glass at prestigious exhibitions.

Glassmaking in the Vysočina Region has a tradition going back at least four centuries. This is not surprising, since the region provided optimal conditions for the industry's development: deep woods supplied the glassworks with sufficient fuel, and there was also a place where quartz for glass production was found.

Glassworks were first recorded here in the sixteenth century. Since their establishment, many of these works have gradually disappeared, although the glass industry has survived in the region into the 21st century.

Let's discover the secrets of glass craft, examine its past and present, and explore the beauty of Czech glass made in the Vysočina Region. We warmly invite you to attend one or more glass-making events, or visit some of the places associated with the glass industry.

Contemporary glassmaking in the Vysočina Region



The Vysočina Region is currently the second most important glassmaking area in the Czech Republic. There are several large glassworks and a number of small glass refineries in operation which are successfully competing against their rivals both home and abroad. Thanks also to educational institutions and a knowledge-base that upholds the tradition, there are also a number of independent glass artists and craftsmen in the Vysočina Region who create melted sculptures, cut and painted glass, stained glass and other glass products.

CAESAR CRYSTAL BOHEMIAE

Significant glassworks

The most important centre of glass-making today is the Světlá region, where Crystalite Bohemia in Světlá nad Sázavou is the dominant force in terms of production volumes. Its production of beverage and decorative glass for hotels, restaurants, shops and households is fully automated. The Bomma glassworks in Světlá focuses on producing designer lighting. CAESAR CRYSTAL BOHEMIAE in Josefodol, on the other hand, is one of the area's traditional producers of colorful cased crystal. The Crystal Glamour glassworks in nearby Okrouhlice produces cut Bohemia lead crystal.

Glassworks are also to be found in the Jihlava region – Merry Crystals in Antonínův Důl (clear and lead crystal) and Gold Crystal in Hruškové Dvory (richly decorated crystal) – and in other parts of Vysočina, e.g. the Janštejn glassworks, producing the exclusive design lighting of the Brokis brand and AGC Fenestra in Moravské Budějovice, which manufactures sheet glass.

Many smaller manufacturers in the Vysočina Region still focus on acclaimed designer glass, where the boundary between perfectly mastered craftsmanship and fine art starts to disappear. Good examples are provided by the AGS Jaroslav Svoboda glassworks in Karlov near Žďár nad Sázavou and the Valner Art Glass studio in Přibyslav.

Other glass attractions of our region include the small glassworks of František Novák in Dobronín. It specializes in producing perfect replicas of drinking glasses and goblets from the 2nd to 18th centuries. A small glassworks in Škrdlovice near Žďár nad Sázavou focuses on glass tourism, recalling for visitors the now long-gone tradition of Škrdlovice glass, once world-famous

Despite shifts in the market and strong competition, glass in the Vysočina Region continues to flourish thanks to the skill, commitment and persistence of local glassmakers.

A unique glass museum from the end of the 18th century with one of the oldest preserved glassworks in Central Europe. There are regular demonstrations of live 'glass-making', glass exhibitions, and workshops. During a guided tour you will learn about the history of the works as well as the technology of glass production and cutting. The museum includes a Bohemia glass shop.

The newly established permanent exhibition — Glassmaking in the Vysočina Region — will guide visitors through the historical and artistic development of glassmaking in the Bohemian-Moravian Highlands, i.e. in the Vysočina Region, from the 16th century to the present. Visitors will be familiarized with the art of the glass-making families operating in the Vysočina Region, the natural origin of glass materials and the activities of glassworks. The products of famous galssworks will also be on display.



Production of hand-blown and cut 24% lead crystal - clear and flashed, cut, gilded and painted. Tours of the glassworks take place every weekday. You can visit the glassworks itself, the drawing studio, the grinding area, and the company shop. Take home a glittering reminder of your experience at the glassworks.

Under the leadership of prof. Jaroslav Svoboda, designer glass pieces have been produced in Karlov since 1990. These objects have won many awards in the Czech Republic and abroad. The production of handmade free blown glass follows in the tradition of the Škrdlovice glassworks, where prof. Svoboda worked as head for many years. Those who are interested can visit the glassworks and watch the glassmakers at work every working day until 1 pm. The tour also includes a glass exhibition with examples of glass production. Workshops are regularly held in the glassworks, with the possibility of painting glass and meeting the glassmaking masters. The glassworks can be visited on weekdays from 8:00-15:00 and on Saturdays from 9:00-14:00. The tour takes in the glassworks itself, an exhibition of original glass sculptures and utility glass, as well as the company shop.

The permanent exhibition displays an extensive collection of glass from well-known glassworks in the Vysočina Region (Milovy, Křižánky, Fryšava and Herálec). In addition to exhibits dedicated to glassmaking, you can also see exhibitions on folk culture, the production and development of skis, ironware, and a school classroom from the 1930s.
